SB 411 Updates: In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet

website or online platform to participate. (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

 - 3. General Public Comment on Non-Agenda Items –Laure Stevens and Ryan Levy addressed the Mulholland Drive issue in item 4d. The chair also provided awesome recent information on Mulholland and decision was made not to address the Mullholland issue further at this time.

 - a. <u>Neighborhood Purposes Grant Friends of Lanai Booster</u>: Motion recommending to the ENC Board that the ENC fund the NPG request from Friends of Lanai Booster in the amount of \$5000 to assist with providing new in-classroom projectors. Pat/Henry 3 Yes 0 No 0 Abstentions
 - b. Motion recommending to the ENC Board that it make a contribution to "Neighborhood Council Budget Day" in the amount of \$2,000 Pat/Henry 3 yes/0 no/0 abstention
 - c. After discussion the following motion was agreed and passed: Motion recommending to the ENC Board that it make a contribution to "Congress of Neighborhoods Event" for the amount of \$2000 Pat/Henry 3 yes/ 0 no/ 0 abstentions
 - d. After discussion the reference to Mulholland Drive ... is removed from consideration at this time. Motion: Recommend that the ENC Board fund a Community Improvement Project(s) in the amount of up to \$10,000 from its Fiscal Year 2023/2024 funds addressing brush clearance and weed remediation on unmaintained medians and parkways along Burbank and Balboa Boulevards and Woodley Avenue in the Sepulveda Basin. Such projects would likely be in conjunction with work contracted by Los Angeles City Council Districts 4 and 6, as applicable to the area, and would include a request that such contribution be prominently acknowledged by signage at the locations as well as in publications. In addition, the ENC would prefer that cleared areas be deeply mulched to retard regrowth of the weeds. Funding would possibly be to organizations similar to and/or including the Los Angeles Conservation Corps.
 - e. Discussion and possible action: Review 2nd revised budget for fye 2023-2024 Worksheet was not

ready because of the issues with generating the MER, but it was briefly discussed and Pat noted She would revise to increase allocation to Community Improvement projects from other unexpended funds.
