BEFORE YOU GO OUT TO COUNT

- ✓ Watch the Homeless Count Volunteer Training Video.
- ✓ Download the Akido Connect App and create an account.
- Check in and receive team assignment, reflective vests, flashlights, and a paper map.
- ✓ Sign and turn in Homeless Count Waiver Form.





Be Sure You And Your Team Members Ask The Deployment Site Coordinator All Of Your Questions Before You Go Count!

STAY COVID-SAFE

- ✓ Maintain social distancing while at deployment site.
- ✓ <u>Please keep your mask on at all times</u>.

TEAMS

NEVER COUNT ALONE!

Look everywhere while being mindful of safety!



- ✓ **DO** seek second opinions from the team if unsure how to count.
- ✓ DO look in alleyways.
- ✓ DO get out and walk to check areas such as behind dumpsters if they cannot be seen from your vehicle.
- ✓ **DO NOT** leave the driver alone in the vehicle.
- ✓ **DO NOT** go inside abandoned buildings.
- ✓ **DO NOT** go into any area that you feel is unsafe but let your deployment site coordinator know about this when you return.

MAPS

- ✓ DO count border streets on one side only.
- ✓ DO count interior streets on both sides.



- ✓ DO check open parking lots.
- ✓ DO count the parking lots of stores and restaurants that allow overnight parking.
- ✓ **DO NOT** count in areas marked "do not count".
- ✓ **DO NOT** count on private property, school campuses, and inside hospitals.
- ✓ DO count on freeway underpasses, including off-ramps and on-ramps keeping your safety in mind
- ✓ **DO NOT** count areas not easily accessible. Special teams will be counting them.

How to Count: People

INDIVIDUALS

- 1. OVER 24 YEARS OLD
- 2. 18-24 YEARS OLD
- 3. UNACCOMPANIED MINORS (< 18)
- ✓ Unless you are very confident that a person is under 25, please count them under "# individuals over 24".
- ✓ DO NOT count BOTH an individual and their dwelling.
- ✓ **DO** count the person(s).
- ✓ An adult couple counts as two individuals and should be counted under the "# individuals over 24."

FAMILIES

- ✓ A family must have at least one child <u>17</u>
 <u>years old or younger</u> and at least one adult 18 or older.
- ✓ **DO** count family units and family members in the "family units" section.
- ✓ DO NOT duplicate family members under individuals.

How to Count: Vehicles / Dwellings



- ✓ **DO NOT** count an RV, car, or van on private residential property.
- ✓ DO NOT knock on doors or disturb people while counting.
- ✓ DO count dwellings when you do not see the occupants inside or nearby.
- ✓ If you hear voices coming from a shelter but cannot see people, only count the shelter.
- ✓ **DO NOT** flash a light inside someone's tent, makeshift shelter, or vehicle.
- ✓ A shopping cart alone is NOT a makeshift shelter.
- ✓ Look for clear signs of homelessness and dividing lines to determine how many dwellings are in one area.



Look for a combination of indicators, because just one indicator is not enough evidence to conclude an individual is experiencing homelessness or if a dwelling is used for inhabiting purposes.

Use your best judgement and look for:

- ✓ Appearance indicators of homelessness: poor hygiene or physical condition, wearing multiple layers of clothing, or carrying multiple large bags.
- ✓ Behavioral indicators include pushing filled shopping carts, or carrying other multiple belongings, as well as sleeping on e ground or on a bench.
- ✓ **Condition** refers to vehicles. Look for signs that it may be used as a sleeping area: blankets covering up the windows, multiple flyers or parking tickets on the windshield, vehicles filled with many belongings, or lights on inside.
