A. Motion

Encino residents have endured years of construction impacts, noise and congestion due to the expansion of the 405 freeway.

Alternate routes need to be found to handle the increased demand on the 405 freeway capacity.

Moved that the ENC oppose any further expansion of the 405 freeway through Sherman Oaks, including widening, elevated trains, mono-rail trains, elevated car pool lanes, toll lanes or express lanes on the 405 freeway. The burden of providing more cross mountain passage must be shared by alternative routes, rather than placing more noise, traffic and congestion impacts on residents living near the 405 freeway.

B. Motion

Ventura Blvd. traffic jams result in a significant loss of fuel, time and money to thousands of Encino residents. Encino residents continue to experience massive traffic tie-ups on Ventura Blvd. due to roadwork conducted throughout the day, often resulting in only one lane of travel.

Moved that the ENC direct the LA Transportation Department to modify its policies to prevent massive traffic daytime tie-ups on Ventura Blvd. due to repairs or construction projects. The City should require that such road work be done on weekends, or evenings, not during the business day, except for emergency repairs. Project owners should bear the extra cost of night or weekend construction on Ventura Blvd. The name of the roadwork contractor and City phone numbers should be prominently displayed on projects during construction, to allow motorists to report tie-ups to proper authorities.
