 - d. **Finance Committee** Budget 2014-2015 Reallocation: Motion passed at Finance Committee Meeting Wed, Sept 3, 2014 reallocating budget for Education and Public Safety Committees
 - Reduce TAC Temp Staff line item in 100 Operations from \$17,900 to \$14,900 and adding a new line item MIS Public Safety Committee Assets & Equipment \$1,500 and move remaining \$1,500 from 100 Operations to 400 Neighborhood Purpose Grants (NPG) leaving 100 Operations subtotal with \$18,400 from \$19,000.
 - Alter 200 Outreach by reducing PLU Planning and Land Use, etc. from \$3,000 to \$1,500 and using the \$1,500 from PLU to a new line item MAT Public Safety Outreach Budget. The subtotal of 200 Outreach stays the same at \$9,100.

- iii. With the \$1,500 moved to 400 NPG, a new line item GRT Education Committee Public School Grants is created for \$5,000. The existing general line item GRT Neighborhood Purpose Grants at \$6,000 sis reduced to \$2,500. Thus, the entire subtotal for 400 NPG is now \$7500 increased from \$6,000.
- iv. The entire budget stays the same at \$37,000 including the \$2,000 subtotal for 300 Community Improvement.
- v. Motion made by Todd Rubinstein and was seconded by George Jawlakian. The motion passed; 3 yes 1 no.
- e. Parks Committee Motion(s) passed at Parks Committee Meeting held on Monday, Sept 8th 2014:
 - i. Motion to support CF 14-1062 Vending and Camping in Public Parks. The proposed amendment to LA Municipal Code Section 63.44 protects the rights of citizens to enjoy the full use of public parks. Further, we support the six-month delay in implementation in order to create a public awareness campaign. We also request that the camping ban be suspended in the event of a disaster such as a large earthquake with reported structural damages. Community Impact Statement to be sent to Arts, Parks, Health, Aging, and River Committee. 5 yes 1 no 0 abstain
- f. City of Los Angeles Elections Lottery Issue: Does the ENC support a lottery of prizes to encourage the citizens of Los Angeles to vote? Herb Wesson, President of the LA City Council would like input from the NC's. Discussion and vote.

The ENC is made up of VOLUNTEERS who are elected by the community who live, work or otherwise are involved in the community of ENCINO. The ENC also makes appropriations of City Funds for Community Projects and needs as requested and approved by various committees and the general board.

<u>PUBLIC INPUT AT ENC MEETINGS</u> - An opportunity for the public to address the Council or Speaker on agenda items will be provided before or during consideration of the item. Members of the public who wish to be recognized on any item are requested to complete a question card for each item they wish to address, and present the completed card(s) to the Sergeant-At-Arms. Speaker cards are available at the back of the meeting room. The Council will also provide an opportunity for the public to speak on any [Non-Agenda Items*] during "Public Comment". The Council may not take any action or discuss matters addressed in "Public Comments". However, the Council President may refer such matters to the appropriate Council Committees for further consideration.

* Public comments are limited to TWO (2) minutes per speaker.

ENC BOARD DISCUSSION AND TIME LIMITS – an ENC Boardmember's request to speak will be recognized by the President in the order requested. For any item, the Chairperson of the Committee, or the maker of the original motion shall have up to THREE (3) minutes to discuss the item. Boardmembers may speak for up to TWO (2) minutes each on the matter unless extended by the President or Council. After all members desiring to speak on a question have had an opportunity to be heard once, the time for each Member desiring to speak again shall be limited to a maximum of ONE (1) minute unless extended by the President or Council. A motion calling the "Previous Question" may be introduced by any member during a Council debate. If adopted, this motion will terminate debate on a matter and the matter will then be submitted for a vote.

<u>VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS</u> - Most motions require a majority vote of the Boardmember's present and voting will be by hand vote unless otherwise decided by the Council. Unless requested for further consideration by an ENC Councilmember, any item that has been forwarded to the Council by a unanimous committee vote shall be approved as a "Consent Item" without further discussion.

TO BE FURTHER NOTED TO ALL IN ATTENDANCE:

Posting of your personal information to the ENC or any public organization can be released upon a request to the ENC according to the CA Public Records Act. You are not required to post your personal information unless you choose to do so.

PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION: The Board of Directors may reconsider and amend its action on items listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular RNC meeting. The Board of Directors, on either of these two days, shall: (1) Make a Motion for reconsideration and, if approved, (2) hear the matter and Take an Action. If the motion to reconsider is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: (1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and (2) a [Proposed] Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A motion for reconsideration can only be made by a Representative who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken, then a Representative on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting.
