3. MOTION: The ENC strongly suggests that the Police Commission reject The Gate's application for Live Entertainment Permit. Due to the proximity of residences and the nature of this community, many neighbors have given considerable testimony against this permit. If this permit is granted by the Police Commission over the objections of the ENC, we recommend that it include the conditions discussed by Councilperson Kortez' Office. Furthermore, the ENC demands that a decibel meter be permanently placed at the property line and inside the restaurant to monitor the level of noise. Additionally, the ENC should provide and fund noise monitoring equipment to the West Valley Police units which will be monitoring some of this activity. Lastly, the ENC requests that signage be required in the parking areas reminding people to respect the residential neighborhood and limiting the noise. Passed PLU 8-0-0



4. The Encino Neighbor Council urges the Los Angeles City Council and Councilperson

Koretz's office to oppose SB827 due to the fact that it negates years of local planning and zoning that protects our community. Although the ENC is in favor of additional low and middle-income housing to alleviate the current housing shortage, it should conform to local codes and ordinances. CF-18-002-S13, CIS to be filed.

### **B. Planning and Land Use Committee**

1. MOTION: The ENC is in favor of letting Verizon Wireless to install the unmanned wireless telecommunication facility as described at 17000 Ventura Blvd. Applicant seeks to install and operate an unmanned wireless telecommunication facility on the rooftop of the existing building. Proposed project is necessary to fill a gap in coverage within the existing Verizon Network. Project will consist of 12 eight-foot panel antennas, 15kw/54-gallon diesel standby generator, and associated equipment. These will all be screened from view with Fiber Reinforced Panels painted and textured to match the existing building. Proposed project will be constructed within the allowable height of 45 ft. The proposed project is consistent with the Ventura Cahuenga Boulevard Corridor Specific Plan and the Los Angeles Municipal Code, as well as, the City of Los Angeles General Plan and Encino-Tarzana Community Plan. The project seeks no variances, adjustments, zone changes or general plan amendments.
