A. Executive Committee

- 1. Approval of an additional \$5.49 spent for Neighborhood Watch Sings. The Neighborhood Watch Signs ordered exceeded the approved amount by \$5.49. **MOTION**: The Encino Neighborhood Council approves the additional \$5.49 spent on Neighborhood Watch Sings. **Passed 4-0-0**
- 2. 2018 2019 Fiscal Year Administrative Packet. **MOTION**: The Encino Neighborhood Council approves the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year Administrative Packet. **Passed 4-0-0**



- 3. ENC Inventory List. Certification/approval of the ENC's current inventory list as reported to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment during the 2017-2018 fiscal year. **MOTION**: The Encino Neighborhood Council approves the inventory list as reported to DONE during the 2017-2018 fiscal year. **Passed 4-0-0**
- 4. **MOTION**: The ENC Executive Committee recommends implementing a tracking system for actions passed, starting with the new fiscal year, to simplify referencing to actions. Actions will be coded by committee (See Executive Committee Attachment B), i.e. EXE-18-7-0001 (Committee, Year, Month and Motion Number). **Passed 4-0-0**
- 5. **MOTION**: The ENC Executive Committee recommends using the Web Corner as our web host provider and will look at upgrading the service to provide a better web experience. **Passed 4-0-0**
- 6. The ENC office does not have an AC unit, on hot days the office becomes unbearable, both with heat and humidity. **MOTION**: The ENC Executive Committee requests up to \$300 to purchase a portable AC until from Walmart. **Passed 4-0-0**
- 7. ENC Board members should have professional name tags for board meetings and events. **MOTION**: The ENC Executive Committee requests up to \$300 to purchase 22 magnetic name badges from Namebadges.com for ENC board members. **Passed 4-0-0**.

B. Outreach Committee:

- 1. MOTION: The ENC Outreach Committee is requesting up to \$115 to purchase a gavel set, including an Oak gavel, sound block and engraving from The Gavel Store. Jim E. moves, Carol L. 2nds. Passed 6-0-0
- 2. MOTION: The ENC Outreach Committee is requesting up to \$100 for printing information for Committee Binders for each committee. Gail R. moves, Miriam D. 2nd. Passed 6-0-0
- **3. MOTION:** The Outreach Committee would like to request from each board member a brief description of their roles and responsibilities to assist with the 2019 elections. Each paragraph should include their respective duties as well as the amount of time each board member spends (each month) on ENC duties and are due by August 7th, 2018. Descriptions will be given the Election Committee once formed. Alex G. moves, Gail R. 2nd. **Passed 6-0-0**.

C. Traffic & Transportation Committee:

- 1. Signal Timing Northbound Hayvenhurst Ave. at Ventura Blvd. **MOTION:** The Encino Neighborhood Council supports adding 3 additional seconds to the Northbound Hayvenhurst Ave. traffic light. Many cycles are three seconds which is not adequate for the volume of cars entering and exiting Gelson's market and the bank/medical building on Ventura Blvd. This is also a heavy pedestrian zone. Kelson/Hand **Passed 6-0-0.**
- 2. MOTION: The Encino Neighborhood Council requests tow-away zones for vehicles 7ft high and 22ft long from 7PM to 7AM from Lindley to Zelzah and Zelzah to White Oak along Oxnard and the Inlet of White Oak (both sides) from Martha to Delano. Bailey/Rosen. Passed 7-0-0



D. Planning and Land Use Committee:

- 1. MOTION: The Encino Neighborhood Council (ENC) formally requests that Councilmember Koretz and/or the office of Council District 5 (CD5) fund an independent Traffic Study in Encino from I-405 to Hayvenhurst Ave. between Ventura Blvd. and Mullholland Dr. to gather empirical data on the current traffic patterns of the area and the potential additional impacts of increased development on the area and its streets; including but not limited to feeder streets such as Dickerson, Sherman Oaks Ave. and Fiume Walk. The ENC proposes to assist CD5 in the selection of a qualified, credentialed and registered traffic engineer for the study. Passed: 8-0-0
- 2. City Planning Departments zoning hearing regarding 16206-16218 Ventura Blvd., Encino Case Number: ZA-2017-1767-ZV-SPP.1. Where the applicant wants to put in 2 single-story buildings with high intensity traffic impacting businesses. MOTION: The ENC rejects all requests for zoning relief and exceptions to include zoning and plan exceptions by applicant in case # ZA-2017-1767-ZV-SPP.1 for 16206-16218 Ventura Blvd. The ENC requests a CIS in the negative be filed and sent to the planning deputy, and that the planning agency abide by the Ventrua Cahuenga plan restrictions in the strictest manner. The ENC also would like to notify the planning agency that despite numerous attempts of requests to bring the specifics of project to be presented in front of the ENC PLU, that the applicant showed willful disregard in said refusal and did not even return repeated requests for information. The ENC also recognizes the local neighborhood concerns voiced during the first hearing at the planning agency for relief of consistent and pervasive traffic impacts to local residence currently facing residence entering or exiting their homes on Dickens Street, and that the additional impacts of a health/gym facility will only exacerbate that situation. Passed 8-0-0

8. Non Consent Items (20 minutes)

A. Traffic & Transportation Committee:

- **1. MOTION:** "Los Angeles decision makers and planners should reevaluate the Los Angeles Bicycle Plan and place a moratorium on construction of new bicycle lanes and facilities in Encino until safety, costs and commuter impacts are resolved." Silver/Rosen. **Passed: 5-1-0.**
- **2. MOTION:** We (The Encino Neighborhood Council) request that the DOT prepare a traffic study of Ventura Blvd from Hayvenhurst to the 405 Freeway and that the finding be given to the Council Office and all relevant parties. Silver/Rosen. **Passed: 5-1-0**

B. Executive Committee:

1. CF18-0467, NC Reform System. David Ryu has introduced a City File to reform the NC System. The Executive Committee is split and proposes the following motions for consideration:

MOTION: The Encino Neighborhood Council supports CF-18-0467, CIS to be filed OR

MOTION: The Encino Neighborhood Council supports CF-18-0467 if amended to not include amending the City Charter Article IX Section 901.d and 904.f and not creating a one-time review process, overseen by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners, to evaluate the NC bylaws to determine if board seats are equitably allocated amongst stakeholder types and provide formal suggestions to NC's on ways to adjust board seats as needed to increase equity (bullet points 3 &4), CIS to be filed.



C. Planning and Land Use:

1. Update on the Curtis School Master Plan (Case No: CPC-2009-837-CU-SPEDRBSPP-SPR-DI-ZV CEQA No. 2: ENV-2009-836-MND). The Curtis School, an approximately 500 student school located at 15871 Mulholland Dr., which serves Developmental Kindergarten – 6th Grade. In 2014 Curtis proposed secondary access road to address neighbor concerns regarding road construction and use (the elimination of the secondary access road also reduces project grading somewhat). As the Plan does not substantively alter the 2014 Plan except to reduce proposed construction. A prior version of this plan was approved by the ENC with some conditions on 3/26/2014.

MOTION: The ENC-PLU has no objections as presented to the proposed expansion plan. Passed 7-0-1. CIS to be filed & CD5 office notified of said finding.
