7. New Business – Non-Funding Consent Items (30 minutes)

Planning and Land Use (Non-Funding Items):

- **A. 4741 Libbit.** A proposed apartment building, 60,000sq.ft., 5 stories with 46 units & 60 parking spaces. **MOTION; PLU-18-11-0005:** The ENC PLU does not support the 4741 Libbit Avenue apartment building as presented on November 13, 2018 due to the lack of parking and guest parking, the height of the building, noise issues, privacy issues for the adjacent houses and traffic issues on Libbit which is a narrow street. Additionally, the building does not comply with the minimum sq.ftg required by Ordinance 174994 of the Encino/Tarzana Community Plan. The ENC PLU would support a building of by-right adherence to the number of units, height, setback and parking requirements and which conforms to the original zoning requirements of Ordinance 174994. **Passed 8-0-0**
- B. Recode LA, Process and Procedures Ordinance; Case No. CPC-2016-3182-CA; Council File: 12-0460-S4, CEQA Case No. ENV-2016-3181-CE. Recode LA will violate the City Charter by giving more authority to the Planning Commission and less to the Neighborhood Councils and City Council. MOTION; PLU-18-11-0006: The Encino Neighborhood Council opposes, in the strongest possible terms, the Processes & Procedures Ordinance; Case No. CPC-2016-3181-CA, Council File 12-0460-S4, CEQA Case No. ENV-2016-3183-CE. The ENC opposition is due to the facts that ordinance weakens safeguards, handcuffs public participation, limits or kills existing public notices and the public's rights to appeal many land-use decisions and gives unappealable decision making power to unelected, political appointees. Furthermore, this Ordinance delegates local control of building decisions to administrative, commissioners, and bureaucrats who have no idea of local concerns, conditions, traffic and continuity of the neighborhood(s) in question. Passed 8-0-0.

Executive Committee (Consent):

- C. Election Outreach MOTION; EXE-18-11-0031: ZIMAS has been suggested to obtain addresses for our 2019 elections, however there's an alternate method. The USPS Every Door Direct Mail Campaign. In the 91316 zip there are 13,632 mailing addresses and in the 91436 sip there are 7,534 mailing addresses. The cost for sending flyers to the 20,986 addresses comes to \$3,735.51. The cost to print the flyers is additional but if we can get printing costs at \$.04 per flyer it comes to \$839.44.
 MOTION; EXE-18-11-0031 The ENC Executive Committee recommends using the USPS Every Door Direct Mail Campaign and defers this to the Ad-Hoc Election Committee for consideration. Lee B. moves, Pat B. 2nds. Passed 3-0-0.
- D. Removal of Alternate Kathy Moghimi-Patterson. Currently Mrs. Moghimi-Patterson does not sit on any committee. Per the Encino Neighborhood Council By-Laws, Section 3, Item B, "Each Representative or Alternate shall join at least one (1) committee by the second meeting of the Board after an election." Mrs. Moghimi-Patterson has not joined a committee since elected in 2016 thus violating the Encino Neighborhood Council By-Laws.
 MOTION: FXF-18-11-0033: The ENC Executive Committee supports voting on the removal of Kathy.
 - **MOTION; EXE-18-11-0033**: The ENC Executive Committee supports voting on the removal of Kathy Moghimim-Patterson as the Alternate At-Large Representative pursuant on the following By-Laws violation; Section 3, Item B, "Each Representative or Alternate shall join at least one (1) committee by the second meeting of the Board after an election. Alex G. moves, Lee B. 2nds. . **Passed 3-0-0**.
- **E.** West Valley Neighborhood Alliance on Homelessness This is a joint effort with other West San Fernando Valley Neighborhood Councils and community partners to communicate with our Stakeholders on homelessness.
 - **MOTION; EXE-18-11-0034**: The ENC Executive Committee supports participating in the West Valley Neighborhood Alliance on Homelessness and using the ENC's name and logo in the effort. Alex G. moves, Lee B. 2nds. **Passed: 3-0-0**
- **F. ENC Secretary** Discussion and possible action on the new ENC Secretary. **MOTION; EXE-18-11-0032**: The ENC Executive Committee recommends Karie Purcell to be the new Encino Neighborhood Council Secretary. Pat B. moves, Lee B. 2nds. **Passed: 3-0-0**.

We can apply our Neighborhood Council to be part of the Welcome, Neighbor program in collaboration with Miry's List and EmpowerLA. This program would give our neighborhood council and Stakeholders a framework for supporting families resettling in Encino and surrounding neighborhoods as refugees. This vote is to complete the application form for Welcome, Neighbor and programming would begin in January. In addition we are seeking a volunteer to act as the Welcoming Liaison.
