## <u>6. NEW BUSINESS – FUNDING:</u>

**6A. YMCA Funding NPG Request (5min):** An NPG has been received from the YMCA requesting \$1000, please see supporting document: NPG YMCA & YWVALLEY Community Story June 2020. **MOTION; EXE-20-06-119**: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the Encino Neighborhood Council support funding the Neighborhood Purposes grant request from the YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles. The grant would provide \$1,000 to be used by the West Valley Family YMCA in support of its pandemic response activities including food and essentials assistance, blood drives, and other services to the community. The board shall include this grant as an encumbrance to its 2019-2020 funds. The funding request will be submitted for funding from 2020-2021 funds. **Passed: 4-0-0.** 

**6B. Street Signs (5min):** The restricted parking times have been changed to ease traffic on Ventura Blvd. Eastbound in the mornings from 9am to 10am and new signs need to be purchased to reflect the change. The cost to purchase new signs is approximately \$14,000. **MOTION; EXE-20-06-120**: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the Encino Neighborhood Council support funding the cost of the signs and will be an encumbrance to its 2019-2020 funds. The funding request will be submitted for funding from 2020-2021 funds. **Passed: 4-0-0**.

#### 7. NEW BUSINESS – NON FUNDING:

**7A.** CF 20-0692 (10min) – A request has been introduced to the City to identify cutting at least \$100 - \$150 million dollars from the LAPD's budget and have the funds reinvested back into disadvantaged communities. Prior to COVID-19 a consistent concern of Encino residents were slow response times from the LAPD. After discussion, the ENC' MOTION; EXE-20-05-121: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the Encino Neighborhood Council *not support* removing funding from the LAPD's budget. Rather than remove funds, the City should support the LAPD by assisting with ongoing descalation training, psychological evaluations of officers, providing best practices guidelines and diverting calls where LAPD officers are not required. Passed: 4-0-0.



**7B.** Introduction of a disaster fund for NCs (5min) – Another disaster will happen in Los Angeles, whether it's another pandemic, natural disaster (earthquake, fire, flood, etc...), or some other emergency each NC should have a dedicated disaster fund that can be self-funded at the end of each fiscal year. NC's should not rely on using existing funds when and if an emergency occurs, especially with the cuts in the new budget. Rather, each NC should be able to self-fund a disaster fund for future use (see supporting document: NC Disaster Fund).

MOTION; EXE-20-06-122: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the Encino Neighborhood Council support requesting the creation of a disaster fund for each NC in the City of Los Angeles which will be self-funded with each NC's budget. This does not replace the current rollover funds each NC is allowed to rollover at the end of each fiscal year, this is in addition to the rollover. Each year each NC should be able to, by board approval, fund up to \$5000 from unused funds into a disaster fund. Funds are specific to each NC. Passed: 4-0-0

7C. CF 20-0190 (5min) – A request to have Park Rangers armed while on duty, refer to supporting document CF 20-0190. MOTION; EXE-20-06-123: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the Encino Neighborhood Council support CF 20-0190 so our Park Rangers can be armed while on duty. Passed: 5-0-0.
