C1. MOTION – Approval of the August 2020 MER

* Pat Bates asked who is ineligible to vote on financial items, a new board member had not completed the required financial training. After the report the MER was approved unanimously, 15 (Y), 0 (N), 1 (I).

D. Sergeant at Arms' Report (2 minutes): Ethics, Funding, Code of Conduct – training required of members.

E. Secretary's Report (5 min): MOTION: Approval of the August General Board Meeting minutes.

4. <u>NEW BUSINESS:</u> Consent Items Funding (10 min)

4A. NC Election Advertising in the Encino Enterprise – The Encino Enterprise has a circulation of 15,000 bi-monthly and 8,000 email subscribers and is specific to Encino. MOTION; OUT-20-09-0038: The ENC's Outreach Committee requests that the Board support advertising the ENC elections in the Encino Enterprise using 5 ads up until the election, starting in December 2020 thru April 2021. The first ad will be a 1/3 page ad (6"x7"), advising of the election, how to apply to run and that everyone needs to register to receive a ballot. Subsequent ads will be smaller, 1/8th (4"x4") of a page each month until April. The 1/3page ad is \$505 and each 1/8th ad is \$175 each, \$50 per ad for spot colors. We request the board approve up to \$1,500 (from the budgeted election funds) for NC election advertising in the Encino Enterprise. Passed: 4-0-0.

4B. NC Elections using the USPS Every Door Direct Campaign & printing postcards locally– The USPS has a program called Every Door Direct based on carrier routes. Total addresses in Encino, 18,946. The total cost to mail postcards to addresses in 91316 & 91436 comes to \$3,258.71. Using a local printer, the Encino Printing House, to approximate cost to print 18,946 post cards is \$1,400. MOTION; EXE-20-09-0127: The ENC's Executive Committee requests that the Encino Neighborhood Council support using the USPS Every Door Direct Campaign to send out postcards to all Encino residents to alert of the upcoming neighborhood council elections, how to receive a ballot and encourage to run for a position. We're requesting the board approve up to \$4,700 (from the budgeted election funds) to use the USPS Every Door Direct campaign and printing postcards from the Encino Printing House. Passed: 5-0-0.

- Question on when the post cards would be sent out. The post cards will be sent to alert residents that there is an election, how to request a ballot and the date of the election. The post cards will be sent prior to the candidate filling period closes.
- A question from a board member about the timing of the ads was brought up.
- Both motions passed: 15 (Y), 1 (N), 1 (I)

5. <u>NEW BUSINESS: (60min)</u>

5A. CF 20-0963: The City is planning on mail only voting in the 2021 neighborhood council elections. They are looking on how to conduct outreach to engage Stakeholders and may consider a drop off box in each region. Encino is in region 3 with a voting date set for May 4th, 2021. Dates for submitting applications as well as the voting portal have not been set. See supporting document, CF 20-0963. MOTION; EXE-20-09-0126 – The ENC's Executive Committee request that the Encino Neighborhood Council support filing a CIS, in favor if amended to include in-person voting at a local polling station or have at least 1 drop-off box in Encino. Passed: 5-0-0.



• After discussion, the motion was voted on. The motion was amended to include where the drop box would be, Fire Station 83 or the Community Center. A request to have in person voting will be included in the motion. The amended motion passed: 16 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

Motion 20-09-114 RE: Council File 20-1011 Title: The Sherman Hotel possible Eminent Domain Acquisition of for Homeless Housing at 15485 Ventura Boulevard:

The ENC (PLU) urges Councilman Koretz to withdraw and rescind the proposed Eminent Domain Motion to acquire the Sherman Hotel located at 15485 Ventura Blvd for a Homeless Shelter. Due to widespread Community concern about the safety of our oldest and youngest citizens. The ENC (PLU) urges CD5 to find a more appropriate location for a Homeless Shelter.

The ENC is willing to help CD5 find a more suitable location. Passed 5-0-0

5C. Motion 20-09-115 RE: Council File 20-1011 Title: The Sherman Hotel possible Eminent Domain Acquisition of for Homeless Housing at 15485 Ventura Boulevard:

The ENC (PLU) urges the Los Angeles City Council and the City Attorney to use all legal means to oppose U.S. District Court Judge David O. Carter injunction ordering Los Angeles City Officials to create immediate shelters for the Homeless in many inappropriate venues. Passed 5-0-0

- Eliot Cohen provided a presentation on the motions.
- Several members of the community spoke against having the Sherman used as shelter and a few were in favor of the use. No one who spoke supported using eminent domain. Alex G. made a point that by using eminent domain it sets a precedent for future motions by City Councilmembers. Furthermore, by not setting up restrictions at this time, it offers no protection to the community in the event that the motion passes City Council.
- After discussion the following motions were voted on:
- 5B Passed 11 (Y) 0 (N), 6 (A) motion passes



• 5C. Item was listened to and discussed. After public comment, board members commented. The final board member comment, by Glenn Bailey, commented that there was no such motion on the September 8th 2020 PLU Committee agenda making it an improper motion, per the Brown Act and the motion is out of order for this meeting agenda. The Chair of the PLU Committee deferred to the Sergeant at Arms who's on the PLU Committee and suggested the motion in committee. Lee Blumenfeld expressed his position as to the nature of how the motion was created, however Glenn Bailey requested to have the item tabled until reviewed by the City Attorney. After a procedural discussion, the motion was revised to be postponed until reviewed by the City Attorney. The Chair of the PLU commented that the item will be on the next PLU committee meeting so it can be heard at the next General Board meeting. Motion to postpone failed. The original motion was voted on. Motion passed: 8 (Y) 0 (N), 4 (A).

5D. In view of the recent events in the Sepulveda Basin and the homeless in the immediate area, the Encino Homelessness Committee makes the following motion:

MOTION; HOM 2020 09 01: the Encino Neighborhood Council Homeless Committee requests that Councilman Paul Koretz, CD 5, Council president Nury Martinez CD 6, and Councilman David Ryu (CD4) work with the Encino and adjacent Neighborhood Councils to investigate a location for a pallet shelter or similar community adjacent to and East of the Tillman Sanitation Plant, and also an RV Safe Parking location on Oxnard Street adjacent to the 405 Freeway. **Passed 5-0-0**

- The meeting was extended to conclude the meeting.
- Item 5D was heard and discussed. After discussion and public comment, the motion was approved as written, passed: 12 (Y), 0 (N), 2 (A)
