## 6. <u>NEW BUSINESS: Funding (10 min)</u>

6A. Funding Lunch for Fire Station 83 and Encino Hospital – Our frontline workers at Encino Hospital and First Responders at Fire Station 83 are overworked and dealing with a high volume of Covid calls. At the onset of the pandemic the ENC provided lunch for the hospital workers. With the surge in new cases and deaths, should the ENC provide lunch for frontline workers at Encino Hospital and first responders at Fire Station 83? MOTION: EXE-21-01-0002: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the ENC support providing lunch to the frontline workers at Encino Hospital and first responders at Fire Station 83 at a cost of \$1,000 (\$500 for the hospital & \$500 for the fire station) from Fresh Bros, Mulberry Pizza or similar. Passed: 4-0-0

• After a brief introduction and no public or board member comment the item was voted on and passed: 17-0-0.

## 7. <u>NEW BUSINESS: (60min)</u>

7A. Erik Yoo on the PLU Committee – Erik Yoo, the ENC's At-Large Alt. has requested to be on the PLU Committee, however a conflict between the Committee Chair and VP has arisen. The Committee Chair denied the request to have Erik Yoo on the committee. Per the ENC's Bylaws, when a conflict arises it will be discussed by the Executive Committee and a recommendation will be brought forth to the board for consideration. MOTION; EXE-21-01-0003: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the board support having Erik Yoo as a voting member on the PLU Committee. Passed 4-0-0

- After a few comments, members of the public spoke on this item, both in favor of having Erik on the committee and against. Several board members spoke in support of having Erik on the committee.
- Several emails from constituents were received opposing the appointment of Erik onto the committee prior to the meeting and have been added to the record.
- A reminder had to be issued to be respectful and to not personally attack board members.
- The Chair of the PLU, Eliot Cohen withdrew his objection to having Erik on the committee.
- Additional board members spoke on the agenda item
- Glenn Baliey, requested clarification that Erik would be on the committee.
- It was confirmed that Erik would be on the PLU committee.

**7B. Review of Comprehensive Crisis Response Strategy: Council File Motion 20-0102.** This appears to be a 12/15/2020 substituted motion requesting that the CAO, LAHSA and the CLA give a verbal report to the Homelessness & Poverty Committee on recommended local initiatives that align with the Governor's Council of Regional Homeless Advisors "Comprehensive Crisis Response Strategy". Further, it directs the Housing and Community Investment Department with assistance of the CAO, LAHSA, the CLA and the City Attorney report on goal of establishing a Right to Housing framework for City of Los Angeles. Possible Community Impact Statements will be considered.
