 - A. **Presentation by Tessa Charnofsky:** an Update on Homelessness Services and Programming in LA County. Tessa is the District Director for the West Valley/Mountain Community office of Sheila Keuhl (Los Angeles County Supervisor of District 3). Followed by question& answer.
 - B. **Round-table discussion:** What are your issues with the homeless in our community. For example, since our last meeting we have had discussions with constituents regarding the trash situation and fire hazard from the encampment south of Burbank Boulevard. What can the Neighborhood Council do to address issues.

- C. Discussion of Committee's Mission & Mission Statement: Homelessness impacts the community and the quality of life of all stakeholders, the homeless and non-homeless alike. The homelessness situation has a high (and long overdue) priority for action and funding by The City and County of Los Angeles and the California State Government. The mission of this committee is to educate and inform our stakeholders on the very complex issue of homelessness and mitigation thereof, empowering and encouraging active participation in potential solutions to address the problem in a productive and humane way. A goal is to assist the Encino Neighborhood Council to communicate the needs and wishes of sheltered and unsheltered stakeholders with our elected officials, and see that services are made available in a fair and equitable manner to Encino as well as to our greater San Fernando Valley communities

Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker per item, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board or Committee.
