The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. General Public Comment is limited to 10 minutes maximum. No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment unless the presiding officer of the Board decides differently.

 - 8.1 Discussion and possible action: Regarding <u>Agenda Item 13</u> of the July 19, 2021 Board of Neighborhood Commissioners meeting, relating to <u>Proposed Amendments</u> to the Code of Conduct Policy presented by Raquel Beltran, General Manager of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment. In particular Item 6 of POLICY NUMBER: 2021-(1): If a Board Member or Committee Member is alleged to have violated either the City's Workplace Equity Policy or the Commission's Code of Conduct, the Department, with written approval from the General Manager, may immediately suspend the Board Member or Committee Member for a period of up to 90 days. Said Board Member or Committee Member shall not be eligible to act on any matter that comes before their Neighborhood Council Board or Committee and shall not be counted for the purpose of establishing a quorum of the Neighborhood Council Board or Committee. The Department will notify the Board Member or Committee Member of their suspension by sending a letter to their last known email address and/or mailing

a. The Department will also notify the Board by email and/or First Class U.S. mail regarding the suspension of the Board Member and that the Board Member's position shall not be deemed vacant during the suspension period

b. The Department shall be the sole decision-maker with respect to a suspension. The Board Member or Committee Member may not appeal the suspension decision.

c. The Neighborhood Council shall retain its authority to remove Committee Members for failure to affirm this policy or for failure to adhere to its provisions.
