 - 8.1 Discussion and possible action: Regarding Agenda Item 13 of the July 19, 2021 Board of Neighborhood Commissioners meeting, relating to Proposed Amendments to the Code of Conduct Policy presented by Raquel Beltran, General Manager of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment. In particular Item 6 of POLICY NUMBER: 2021-(1): If a Board Member or Committee Member is alleged to have violated either the City's Workplace Equity Policy or the Commission's Code of Conduct, the Department, with written approval from the General Manager, may immediately suspend the Board Member or Committee Member for a period of up to 90 days. Said Board Member or Committee Member shall not be eligible to act on any matter that comes before their Neighborhood Council Board or Committee and shall not be counted for the purpose of establishing a quorum of the Neighborhood Council Board or Committee. The Department will notify the Board Member or Committee Member of their suspension by sending a letter to their last known email address and/or mailing
 - a. The Department will also notify the Board by email and/or First Class U.S. mail regarding the suspension of the Board Member and that the Board Member's position shall not be deemed vacant during the suspension period
 - b. The Department shall be the sole decision-maker with respect to a suspension. The Board Member or Committee Member may not appeal the suspension decision.
 - c. The Neighborhood Council shall retain its authority to remove Committee Members for failure to affirm this policy or for failure to adhere to its provisions.

This was the last item addressed during the meeting. After extensive discussion a motion was made to prepare a Community Impact Statement to the Board of Neighborhood commissioners opposed to the proposed Amendments to the Code of Conduct, noting that it would be referred to the Encino Neighborhood Council Executive Committee for further study and further that the Board of Neighborhood commissioners extend the period for comment to at least 90 days. Motion passed 18 Yes/0/0/2 Absent
