- 4-1. Left-hand turn arrow fading to green on White Oak (S) to Burbank Blvd (E).

 - 4-2. Parking meter timing: The signs should be changed back to 8 AM to 6 PM. on Paso Robles and Genesta North of Ventura Blvd next to the Encino Park and Encino Women's Club.
 - 4-3. Crosswalk lights on Balboa Blvd @ Addison by the Fire Station. This is close to Encino Charter Elementary School and is needed for safety.
 - 4-4. Left hand turn arrow fading to green on Petit (N) to Ventura Blvd (W). A huge backup on Petit blocking the driveway of Jerry's Deli and the Bank of America.
 - 4-5. Signal timing on Sepulveda Blvd at Valley Meadow Rd. The signal on Sepulveda Blvd seems to work like a stop sign some of the time for traffic calming. The signal for Sepulveda Blvd will turn red and no one is on Valley Meadow Rd. This has been happening for years.
