Discussion and Possible Action: Permitted Fireworks displays adjacent to residential communities: The City of Los Angeles apparently has neither neighborhood notification requirements nor ascertainable standards which are readily available to the public for permitting professional fireworks displays adjacent to residential neighborhoods, yet film productions which use pyrotechnics require expanded community outreach and notification. The City of Los Angeles has been very active in attempting to combat illegal fireworks, which, in addition to posing a fire danger frightens residents and pets alike. However, the City inexplicably permits unpublicised and episodic professional fireworks displays adjacent to residential neighborhoods, including on property under the purview of the Department of Recreation & Parks.

 Consider a Community Impact Statement directed to the Los Angeles City Council and the Board of Recreation & Parks Commissioners requiring either a public hearing on any such event at least 30 days prior to the event (or commencement of a series of events) and/or a stringent notification requirement of residents who will be impacted. Further, any permit granted by any City of Los Angeles Department for

such a display, including any attached diagrams regarding placement and size of devices, should be available for public inspection at least 60 days prior to the event. There should be a designated city official charged with evaluating public input on the proposed event with authority to deny the permit and further to refer the matter to the City Attorney in the case a resolution can not be achieved.
