- 1. **Call to Order**, Start recording. Roll call, determination of quorum, selection of voting Parks and Environment committee Members, Selection of Secretary for the meeting.
- 2. **Approval of Committee minutes**. Discussion and possible action to approve draft Parks and Environment Committee <u>Minutes</u> of the November 14, 2021 meeting.

3. New Business Action Items: Votes may be taken on all action items.

- **A.** Discussion and possible action: Regarding care and maintenance of our <u>oak trees</u> (and ultimately other trees): safety considerations, arrangements should be made for a presentation
- **B.** Discussion and possible action Bureau of Streets Services (StreetsLA) <u>Tree Inventory</u> in Encino is complete; report is <u>linked here</u>. Arrangements should be made for a presentation at the next available ENC Board meeting. Where do we go from here to increase and improve street trees?
- C. Discussion and possible action: <u>CF 20-1205-S1</u>, filed 12/08/2021, notes that: "The Bureau of Engineering is developing the Master Plan for the Sepulveda Basin, called the Sepulveda Basin Vision Plan Project (Project), and is slated to start work on the Feasibility/Conceptual Study Phase in early 2022. The Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy has stated that the Project is eligible for a grant related to the Upper Los Angeles Rivers and Tributaries. In order to fund the Feasibility/Conceptual Phase of the Project, the Bureau of Engineering would like to apply for \$950,000 in grant funds from the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy." The ENC filed a Community Impact Statement on <u>CF 20-1205</u> noting, among other things, that it supports a new master plan for the Sepulveda Basin on the condition that it includes provision for informing and consulting with community groups including the Encino and Lake Balboa Neighborhood councils. We can re-file the same CIS under CF 20-1205-S1, but we should discuss filing a supplemental based of the fact that the Encino Neighborhood Council has not been informed of anything regarding what is clearly going on.
- D. **Discussion and possible action** The Balboa Sports Center has requested the purchase of following items that would benefit park patrons (one or more of these items may be included on a subsequent Neighborhood Purposes Grant Application):
 - D.1. Portable PA system and wireless handheld microphone (quote \$1447.58 not including shipping)
 - D.2. Five folding tables (quote \$2,764.90 not including tax and shipping)
 - D.3. Lesser priority: Two-door enclosed bulletin board display case (quote \$400.99 not including tax and shipping)
- E. **Discussion and possible action** <u>CF 15-0989</u>: LA28 and the City of Los Angeles: Review the Games agreement; consider requesting a presentation on proposed Sepulveda Basin venues; consider Community Impact Statement requesting that Neighborhood Councils including or adjoining venue areas be consulted as a first step in community outreach, rather than as an afterthought.
