Neighborhood Purposes Grants

Neighborhood Purposes Grants (NPGs) provide NCs opportunities to develop partnerships with local 501(c)(3) nonprofits and public schools to build community and enhance neighborhoods in the City of Los Angeles. Projects and activities supported by NPGs vary widely and can include, but are not limited to:

- The Arts
- Beautification
- Community Support
- Education
- Community Improvements

NPG-funded projects and activities must be for a **public benefit** and purpose, **open**, **accessible**, and **free of charge** to stakeholders.

Grants approved by NCs exceeding \$5,000 involve further review and possible City contract by the Office of the City Clerk.

There are two NPG Information Packets; One for prospective applicants to help guide them in the application process, and one for NC board members outlining considerations and factors to keep in mind while evaluating NPG requests.

A “Project Completion Report” template is also provided to help ensure accountability in the use of Grant funds and help demonstrate how NCs and their partners are supporting L.A. communities and stakeholders. NCs and NPG recipients are strongly encouraged to work together to complete and submit the Report at the conclusion of the project.

SECTION II: PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

Los Angeles Fire Department Station 83 in Encino (4960 Balboa Blvd.) was opened in January 2006. In 2021 some of the exterior landscaping was upgraded to be similar to that of the adjacent LADWP substation, the ENC provided some of the funding for that. Station 83 has an extraordinary amount of plantable land, both inside its fenced area and outside. The City does not provide any funding for maintenance of the station grounds, that has to be either done by the station personnel or the personnel have to pay for services out of their pockets. The original landscaping was put in over 15 years ago, and much of the landscaping and the drip irrigation system are in disrepair. As a result of the COVID pandemic and the large amount of area, the station needs help. The intent of the present grant is to provide funding for preparation of the interior areas, at least beginning repairs on the irrigation system, mulching, and planting a native drought-resistant low maintenance pollinator-friendly plant palette - for example, Toyon, BladderPod, Sage, and probably some succulents. Some funding will be reserved for ongoing maintenance. The maintenance need will decrease as the plantings become established.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large.(Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

The City of Los Angeles is the largest U.S. city to date certified as a biodiversity haven by the National Wildlife Federation - and Station 83 can make a major contribution to this effort. A local non-profit environmental organization already funded, installed, and is maintaining a biodiversity pollinator garden pilot project at the northeast corner of Station 83. As a result the station is eligible for designation as a National Wildlife Federation certified wildlife habitat (a bird bath will be added inside the gated area to complete the requirements). This grant request from the Encino Neighborhood Council will enable extension of the habitat to the remaining exterior portion on the north side of the station, as well as throughout the area inside the fence. Among the many public benefits of this is the exterior areas will be an accessible living advertisement for drought-resistant native planting, and will serve as an educational location for nearby elementary schools, and in the summer provide a nice shady area to enjoy the garden. The interior areas will also support pollinators, bugs, and birds, and significantly reduce day-to-day maintenance requirements once established.
