- 4. Encino Traffic/Transportation Wish list: UPDATE: New list to be determined.
 - 4.1. Left-hand turn arrow fading to green on White Oak (S) to Burbank Blvd (E). 7:30-9:30 AM
 - 4.2. Parking meter timing: The signs should be changed back to 8 AM to 6 PM. on Paso Robles and Genesta North of Ventura Blvd next to the Encino Park and Encino Women's Club.
 - 4.3. Crosswalk lights on Balboa Blvd @ Addison by the Fire Station. This is close to Encino Charter Elementary School and is needed for safety.
 - 4.4. Left hand turn arrow fading to green on Petit (N) to Ventura Blvd (W). A huge backup on Petit blocking the driveway of Jerry's Deli and the Bank of America.
 - 4.5. Signal timing on Sepulveda Blvd at Valley Meadow Rd. The signal on Sepulveda Blvd seems to work like a stop sign some of the time for traffic calming. The signal for Sepulveda Blvd will turn red and no one is on Valley Meadow Rd. This has been happening for years.

- 8. East driveway of the new Target Center: The neighbors on Andasol (S side of Ventura Blvd were never informed of the signal going in. Working with CD4, let's support the neighbors. Motion: The ENC T/T committee supports signage for Left or Right turn only exiting the Target Center East driveway. If this does not work, the residents might consider candlesticks in the street to allow cars to exit but not enter.
- 9. Mulholland Dr on the Mulholland Bridge, most of the candlesticks in the street are missing separating the right turn lane from the thru traffic lane. Motion to replace these missing candlesticks.
