- a. Neighborhood Purpose Grants--Review applications and determine proposed awardees, to put forward to the General Board for 3-23-22 meeting.

Motion: The education committee recommends that the ENC approve a Neighborhood Purpose Grant for \$3000. to the Academy of Enriched Sciences, to replace damaged outdoor shade canopies that protect children eating lunch and doing other school activities outside during the COVID-19 pandemic and to fix the school's marquee sign to include the owl scholar logo and STEM icon.

Motion to approve: Julie Goldstein, second: Shelly Rivlin. Passed: (3-0)

There was discussion on the Portola Middle School Grant. The application stated that the program would be funded on May 1, 2022 and start on August 1, 2022. This would be in conflict with ENC NPG procedures. It was agreed that the application will be amended to show a start date of May 1, 2022.

Motion: The education committee recommends the ENC approve a Neighborhood Purpose Grant to Portola Middle School for \$3500. for a student Mock Trial Program that includes instruction, teacher preparation, materials and a field trip to the Municipal Courts.

Motion to approve: Julie Goldstein, second: Shelly Rivlin Passed. (3-0)

The committee noted that they only received NPG's from two schools out five that were contacted. In the future, more diligent follow up with community schools should be exercised.
