IN CONFORMITY WITH THE SEPTEMBER 16, 2021 ENACTMENT OF CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLY BILL 361 (RIVAS) AND DUE TO CONCERNS OVER COVID-19, THE ENCINO NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETING WILL BE CONDUCTED ENTIRELY WITH A CALL-IN OPTION OR INTERNET-BASED SERVICE OPTION

Public comment on agenda items will be heard only when the item is up for discussion. Public comment on agenda items is limited to 1 minutes per agenda item. Time may be adjusted at the Chair's discretion. Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items is limited to TWO MINUTES (2) per speaker. Time may be adjusted at the Chair's discretion. Public calling in, please press *9 on your phone to raise your hand to speak. For those that are using the Zoom Webinar please use the raise your hand feature to speak. The amount of time for public comment on each agenda item is to be determined by the Chair at each meeting. Speakers shall limit their comments to matters relevant to the item on the agenda. The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously



during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item. AB 361 Updates: Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

- 1. **Call to Order**, Start recording. Roll call, determination of quorum, selection of voting and Alternate Parks and Environment Committee Members, Selection of Secretary for the meeting.

 NOTE: Per the ENC Bylaws, all Representatives and Alternate Representatives must be current on all required trainings in order to vote or make or second motions.
- 2. Approval of Committee minutes. There are no minutes for approval at this meeting.
- 3. Report/Presentation from any Agencies/Organizations present:
 - A. Tiffany Franklin, Director of Regional coordination, LA Family Housing
 - B. Any other agencies/departments/NGOs
- 4. **Public Comment on Non-Agenda Items** within the Committee's subject matter jurisdiction Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items is limited to TWO MINUTES (2) per speaker. - 5. New Business Action Items: Votes may be taken on all action items.
 - A. Discussion and possible action: A motion recommending the board of the ENC approve participation in the 2023 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count (usually the end of January). Motion: The ENC Homelessness Committee recommends that the ENC participate in the 2023 Greater Los Angeles homelessness Count by staffing the Encino deployment center, soliciting volunteers, and requests up to \$250 for related expenses such as snacks for volunteers, printing and other related costs.
 - B. Discussion and possible action: Regarding encampments in high-fire risk areas. Motion: The ENC Homelessness committee recommends that the Board file a Community Impact Statement with the City Council, Mayor's Office, and Fire Marshall to request amendment of Ordinance 186294 to expand application to areas with extreme fire potential that are not in Very High Fire Severity

Hazard Zones (e.g. Sepulveda Basin), and further institute an immediate "zero tolerance" policy for any encampments or noticed trespassing in such areas, subject to criminal trespassing sanctions and immediate removal of persons and any materials deposited in the area by appropriate outreach and sanitation personnel. Any action would reference the ordinance and <u>CF 19-0050</u>.

C. Discussion and possible action: There is discussion and a perception that the number of people experiencing homelessness in Encino has increased. Consider actions to take including collection of data by the ENC, and investigation of factors affecting the increase (if any), and resources to follow up with.

6. Informational Items/Reports/Updates

- **A. 2022 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count data are published.** For LAHSA data and reports use this <u>link</u>. For the LAHSA informational slides announcing the release use this <u>link</u>. For our initial census-district level count for Encino use this <u>link</u>. Bottom line, the count shows about 30 unsheltered and 17 sheltered (Project Room-Key) individuals in the non-Sepulveda Basin area of Encino, and about individuals and about 52 in the basin.
- **B.** The City Council passed motion <u>CF 22-0941</u> Motion (de Leon Blumenfield) relative to requesting the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority to provide full access to the Homeless Management Information System, to the Council District Homeless Coordinators. This should be followed up to ensure action.
- **C.** The city council passed <u>CF 22-0002-S107</u> Resolution (Raman Blumenfield) relative to the including in the City's 2021-22 State Legislative Program its position on legislative or administrative action to enact changes to the California Health and Safety Code that will increase the daily reimbursement rate for board and care home residents who receive SSI, SSP, or Medi-Cal. It is unclear whether this was communicated to the State legislators.
- **D.** The City council passed <u>CF 21-0002-S191</u> requesting that the Governor apply for the §1115 Medicaid waiver to allow for expansion of Medicaid coverage to adults in need of in-patient mental health treatment. The waiver has been requested by many parties is it being done?
- E. On 10/7/2022 the Los Angeles city council passed 3 significant motions CF <u>22-0978</u> and <u>22-0979</u> regarding developing 24/7 unarmed response to non-violent situations including homelessness, and <u>22-0799-S1</u> regarding LAHSA governance issues and reform of the regional homelessness response system. Reports are requested on all.
