Public Comment: Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items is limited to TWO MINUTES (2) per speaker. Time may be adjusted at the Chair's discretion. Public calling in, please press *9 on your phone to raise your hand to speak. For those that are using the Zoom Webinar please use the raise your hand feature to speak.

The amount of time for public comment on each agenda item is to be determined by the Chair at each meeting. Speakers shall limit their comments to matters relevant to the item on the agenda. The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item.

A member of the public wishing to speak on more than one agenda item at a single meeting shall limit his or her remarks to a total of one minute per item and five (5) minutes per meeting. Members of the public who want to speak on multiple agenda items for up to five (5) minutes at one time can choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items Comment period. Otherwise comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Members of the public who choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items period will be given the opportunity to also speak during General Public Comment. Please be aware that time accumulates for any agenda items commented on.

Comments from the public on matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment, unless the presiding officer of the Board decides differently.

AB 361 Updates: Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

8. NEW BUSINESS CONSENT ITEMS: Items 8A. thru 8C. all passed their respective committees with full consent, following discussion by committee members and the public. Public comment was taken on all of the following consent items in committee. Planning and Land Use

A. Smart and Final - Smart and Final Store #477 located at 16847 W. Ventura Blvd., seeks a Conditional Use Permit of the off-site sale of a full-line of alcoholic beverages. Documents may be viewed here: <u>Documents</u>. MOTION: The ENC's PLU Committee recommends the ENC approves case # as presented along with any recommendations from the police commission. Passed: 6 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

B. <u>CF 23-104</u> Small Housing Provider Assistance Program - LA City Council members proposed City Council file 23-104 for a \$10M Relief Program for Small Landlords. Proposed MOTION: The ENC's PLU Committee recommends that the ENC support the 10 Million Dollar Small Housing Assistance Program for landlords and encourages a larger amount. Passed: 7 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

Executive Committee:

C. City Clerk Budget Increase for NC Elections - To make voting in NC elections easier, the City Clerk should mail a ballot to registered voters within the city of Los Angeles, if requested. An estimate of 2.5 million dollars was presented as a cost of postage, the printing is an additional cost. As an example, the special election for CD6 is running about \$7.6 million dollars. Although a large figure, making it easier to receive a ballot will increase voter participation in NC elections. MOTION: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends the board support requesting the budget advocates recommend adding up to 7 million dollars to the City Clerk's budget to allow for the printing and mailing of NC election ballots to registered voters within the City of Los Angeles. Passed: 4 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

Planning and Land Use:

- A. Al Fresco Dining Ordinance LA City's draft Al Fresco Ordinance may be read here: <u>Al Fresco</u>. The ordinance was discussed by the ENC's PLU Committee on Feb. 16, 2023 and the following recommendation is presented; MOTION: The ENC's PLU Committee recommends that theENC not support the Al Fresco Ordinance as currently written and urges a more friendly ordinance that will help restaurant owners succeed. Passed: 5 (Y), 1 (N), 0 (A)
- B. 4954 Encino Ave, Case #: ZA-2020-179-CU The applicant seeks a conditional use permit to convert a single family home into a place of worship. The case summary may be read here: <u>Case Summary</u>. The item was discussed at the Feb. 16, 2023 Planning and Land Use Committee meeting. The PLU Committee presents the following motion; MOTION: The ENC's PLU Committee recommends the ENC to conditionally support the CUP subject to all conditions agreed upon in the settlement are being met. Passed: 5 (Y), 0 (N), 2 (A)

Added at the discretion of the President:

- C. Restoration of the annual budget During the first 7 years of the NC system, the annual budget for NCs was \$50,000, the amount was reduced due to the 2008 recession and has not been restored. Additionally, NCs should be able to rollover up to \$100,000 from the 2 previous fiscal years. The fiscal year 2023-2024 budget council file will be 23-600 (to be established soon). Possible motion: The ENC supports restoring the NC annual budget to \$50,000 with a rollover of up to \$100,000 from the two previous fiscal years. Discussion and possible action.
- D. LADWP MOU The Board of Water and Power Commissioners has approved renewal of our Neighborhood Council - Department of Water and Power Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) for another five years. The newly revised document is available here: "LADWP-NC MOU Renewal" Each neighborhood council needs to agendize a board vote to approve Participation in the MOU. Possible MOTION: The ENC supports participating in the LADWP NC MOU. Discussion and possible action.
