Public Comment: Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items is limited to TWO MINUTES (2) per speaker. Time may be adjusted at the Chair's discretion. Public wishing to speak on non-agenda items will fill out a speaker card and turn it in to the Secretary.

The amount of time for public comment on each agenda item is to be determined by the Chair at each meeting. Speakers shall limit their comments to matters relevant to the item on the agenda. The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item.

A member of the public wishing to speak on more than one agenda item at a single meeting shall limit his or her remarks to a total of one minute per item and five (5) minutes per meeting. Members of the public who want to speak on multiple agenda items for up to five (5) minutes at one time can choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items Comment period. When turning in the speaker card, indicate which items you wish to speak on. Otherwise comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Members of the public who choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items period will be given the opportunity to also speak during General Public Comment. Please be aware that time accumulates for any agenda items commented on.

Comments from the public on matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment, unless the presiding officer of the Board decides differently.

A. Ventura/Cahuenga Planning Review Board:

It is critical that Encino regain its seat on the PRB, the ENC previously requested that membership on the PRB move to community based rather than by council district and now we should reintroduce our motion with more specific language. MOTION: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the board support that the Ventura/Cahuenga PRB should have two representatives from Cahuenga, Studio City, Sherman Oaks, ENCINO, Tarzana, and Woodland Hills, plus a Mayor's appointee. Passed: 5 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

B. VNY - Motion in support of September 2023 Community Presentation on VNY Airport Plan.

MOTION: "Whereas the Van Nuys Airport Citizens Advisory Council (CAC) on October 3, 2023 adopted a "6 Steps to Success" process diagram for re-directing the Vision Study, and since this process is consistent with the CIS adopted by the ENC on September 27, 2023, ENC is hereby indicating its support of the "6 Steps to Success" process diagram contained in the CAC October 3, 2023 adopted motion, and recommends that the Mayor of Los Angeles, the City Council, the Board of Airport Commissioners, and Los Angeles World Airports be advised to consider adopting this 6 Steps to Success process going forward for the benefit of communities impacted by Van Nuys Airport". Passed: 5 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

C. Conditional Use Permit - Chick-Fil-A.

MOTION: The ENC's Planning and Land Use Committee recommends that the board supports the neighborhood's proposed findings that the Zoning Administrator determine that:

- 1) The Traffic Mitigation implemented by Chick-Fil-A and the City of Los Angeles has not substantially eliminated the adverse traffic impacts and other adverse impacts on the adjacent neighborhood; and
- 2) In accordance with Condition 50 on the 2020 Plan Approval adopted by the South Valley Area Planning Commission, the Zoning Administrator should initiate revocation of the Drive-Thru Conditional Use Permit (CUP) pursuant to LAMC Section 12.27.1 Passed: 7 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)

## 10. New Business:

A. **4954** Encino Avenue Conditional Use Permit – The ENC's PLU Committee discussed the application for a Conditional Use Permit to convert a residence into a House of Worship at 4954 Encino Avenue.

Following discussion the following motion was voted on - MOTION: The ENC's Planning and Land Use Committee recommends that the ENC Board request the Zoning Administrator to DENY the request for Conditional Use Permit to convert the single family home to a house of worship based on the following facts:

- 1) That the Applicant has operated his house of worship illegally since 2019
- 2) That the Applicant failed to cease illegal use even after being cited by the City in April 2019
- 3) That the Applicant then failed to comply with his own agreed-upon operating conditions in an agreement with the Neighbors
- 4) That the Applicant then failed to comply with Court Orders as to operating conditions set forth in the Court Judgement dated June 21, 2023

  In the event the Zoning Administrator disregards such continuous violations of the Court Judgement and agreed upon operating conditions for synagogue use, any CUP approval shall include the same agreed-upon conditions as set forth in the Court Judgement.

Passed: 7 (Y), 1 (N), 0 (A)

B. **Board Restructure** – The Encino Neighborhood Council is officially filing forms to restructure the Board by reducing the number of board representative seats from 22 to 18. In addition, there would be a total of 10 board alternate board seats instead of 23. The total board would be 18 representatives with a quorum of 9 required.

The new board structure would be:

- -Area Representatives (Areas 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7): 7 total + 7 Alternates
- -Planning & Land Use Representative: 1 total
- -Parks & Environment Representative: 1 total
- -Business Representatives: 2 total
- -At Large: 3 total
- -Grass Roots Representative: 1 total
- -Homeowners/Condo Representative: 1 total
- -Renters Representative: 1 total
- -Youth Representative: 1 total + 1 Alternate (the Youth Representative would be a voting board member)
- -Ranked Alternate Seats: 3 total \*taken from a pool of runners up from election for all seats (besides Area Representatives and Youth Representative), ranked in order of vote counts (open Alternate Seats could also be filled by application after the election)

MOTION: The ENC's Executive Committee recommends that the board support the recommendation presented by the Bylaws committee and approve the board restructure as presented. Passed: 5(Y), 0(N), 0(A)
