- 4. New Business Motion, Discussion, and Voting may be taken on all Items:
 - A. Discussion and possible action regarding Assembly Bill 467 (Fong), which seeks to extend the authorization for Neighborhood Councils to use alternate teleconferencing provisions for remote meetings until January 1, 2031. The

Executive Committee will consider supporting the <u>Resolution</u> (Padilla -Blumenfield), currently referred to the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee (<u>25-0002-S13</u>), and aligning with the Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition (LANCC), which supports AB 467 (Fong) with a recommendation for two amendments. This item includes review of the Chief Legislative Analyst's <u>report, dated April 8, 2025</u>.

- **B.** Update on the City Clerk's Neighborhood Council Funding Program Workgroup, which will be meeting from April 21 through June 30, 2025. Region 3 currently has three appointees, including representatives from Reseda NC and Lake Balboa/Winnetka NCs. Additionally, an Encino NC Board member has been appointed to the workgroup from another region. This item will provide a brief overview of the workgroup's scope and timeline. A similar update has been requested for the Finance Committee agenda.
- C. Agenda Item: Discussion on strategies to improve voter turnout and outreach for future Encino Neighborhood Council elections. With reports of low participation in the 2025 election cycle, the Executive Committee will explore potential approaches such as enhancing digital outreach through social media and neighborhood platforms, partnering with local schools, businesses, and community organizations to raise awareness, and implementing grassroots tactics like vote-tripling to encourage broader engagement from stakeholders.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no

further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

(C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.

(D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

(E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph

(D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
