# **Neighborhood Purposes Grants**

Neighborhood Purposes Grants (NPGs) provide NCs opportunities to develop partnerships with local 501(c)(3) nonprofits and public schools to build community and enhance neighborhoods in the City of Los Angeles. Projects and activities supported by NPGs vary widely and can include, but are not limited to:

- The Arts
- Beautification
- Community Support
- Education
- Community Improvements

NPG-funded projects and activities must be for a *public benefit* and purpose, **open**, *accessible*, and *free of charge* to stakeholders.

Grants approved by NCs exceeding \$5,000 involve further review and possible City contract by the Office of the City Clerk.

There are two NPG Information Packets; One for prospective applicants to help guide them in the application process, and one for NC board members outlining considerations and factors to keep in mind while evaluating NPG requests.

A "Project Completion Report" template is also provided to help ensure accountability in the use of Grant funds and help demonstrate how NCs and their partners are supporting L.A. communities and stakeholders. NCs and NPG recipients are strongly encouraged to work together to complete and submit the Report at the conclusion of the project.

# **Neighborhood Purposes Grant Application - AYSO Encino**

# Section II - Project Description & Community Benefit

## **QUESTION 4 – Project Description**

AYSO Region 33, based in Encino, CA, is seeking funding to host two free youth soccer clinics for children under the age of 12 in June and July of this year. These community-based clinics will be open to all families in the area, with a special focus on promoting inclusivity, teamwork, and sportsmanship—core values of AYSO. We have set tentative dates of Saturday, June 14th & Saturday, July 19th.

Each clinic will provide instruction in soccer fundamentals, including ball control, passing, shooting, and defensive techniques. In addition to skills development, the event will feature a highly engaging inflatable penalty kick challenge and a friendly competition organized by age brackets to encourage participation and fun.

The clinics are designed to be a welcoming introduction to soccer for beginners, while also offering enrichment opportunities for current players. The events will promote community engagement and raise awareness of the Encino Neighborhood Council's support of youth activities, alongside AYSO's commitment to building character through sport.

## **QUESTION 5 – Community Benefit**

This project directly benefits the Encino community by offering two free youth soccer clinics focused on promoting physical activity, teamwork, inclusivity, and community engagement. The clinics are open to all children between the ages of 4 and under 12 years old, regardless of experience level, and are designed to foster skill development, sportsmanship, and a lifelong appreciation for the game.

A standout feature of the event is the volunteer leadership provided by the Encino Heat, the girls under-12 AYSO Region 33 All-Star team. These young athletes, with the support of their coaches and parents, successfully organized a smaller-scale clinic in March and also participated in the April 27th Encino Fest hosted by the Encino Neighborhood Council—where their inflatable penalty kick challenge drew enthusiastic community participation.

Due to the popularity and impact of these events, we plan to scale them into larger, community-centered experiences with the Neighborhood Purposes Grant from the Encino Neighborhood Council. The events will not only support local youth development but also empower the Encino Heat players as role models and community ambassadors. These clinics provide both educational and social value—promoting healthy lifestyles and building a stronger sense of neighborhood identity. The clinics will be promoted through AYSO Region 33's extensive communication channels, including their email distribution lists, website, and Instagram accounts, along with those of the Encino Heat team. With added visibility from the Encino Neighborhood Council, we anticipate strong turnout and engagement, with an estimated 50–75 youth participants per clinic, though we will not have a restriction on the number of attendees.

## QUESTION 6a & 6b – Personnel & Non-Personnel Related Expenses


The total estimated cost to host the two youth soccer clinics is **\$2,825.00**. We are respectfully requesting funding in the amount of **\$2,525.00** from the Encino Neighborhood Council through the NPG program. The funds will be used to cover essential costs such as field permits, insurance, equipment purchases & rentals, to ensure a safe, engaging, and well-organized experience for participants.

Additional equipment and services—including goals, cones, pinnies, flags, and registration tables—will be provided in-kind by AYSO Region 33 at no cost, helping to keep the budget efficient while ensuring a quality experience. Supplemental marketing support will also be provided at no cost via AYSO and Encino Heat Instagram accounts and websites. Lastly, AYSO Region 33 has also offered to contribute up to an additional \$300.00 towards the costs of the inflatable rental.


