 - ii. Ensures the card is used for payment transactions as approved by the board only.iii. Obtains itemized receipts or itemized paid invoices for every card transaction.

 - vii. Notifies NC Funding Program upon resignation or removal as the NC bank cardholder.
 - 1. The NC will be limited from accessing its available funds through the bank card when a cardholder has resigned or has been removed and a new card is being requested from the bank for a newly-appointed cardholder.
 - viii. Can only serve as a cardholder for one NC at a time.
 - ix. Is the only board member authorized to pick up the NC bank card, issued to his/her name, from the NC Funding Program Office.

14. New Business – Funding

- A. Motion: ENC will host a town hall about encampments in the Sepulveda Basin and wildfire. Representatives from key organizations will be invited to participate. Public Safety Committee recommends funding up to \$250 for food & drink and up to \$100 for promotion including social media boosts and facility fee.
- B. Motion: Discussion and possible action on the recommendation from the Outreach Committee that the Encino Neighborhood Council support the Harvest Moon Movie Night event on Saturday, September 27th, at Genesta Park, featuring a screening of *E.T.*, and approve the expenditure of up to \$7,000 for event-related costs.

15. New Business - Consent Calendar: Items 15A thru 15C all passed with unanimous consent, following discussion by committee members and the public. Public comment was taken on all of the following consent items in committee. Unless a board member pulls an item, items 15A through 15CDwill be deemed approved unanimously by the Encino Neighborhood Council. If an item is pulled, the remaining consent items will pass by consent and the pulled items will be discussed in the order on the agenda.

- A. Motion: The Encino Neighborhood Council formally requests that the City of Los Angeles, in coordination with all relevant agencies, enforce <u>LAMC Sec. 63.44</u> (Regulations Affecting Park and Recreation Areas) to the fullest extent including, but not limited to, the eviction of unhoused occupants and their encampments. We also request for vegetation and combustible material to be cleared in compliance with all local and state fire codes. The Public Safety Committe recommends sending a letter to the City, elected representatives and all relevant agencies advising them of our demands for action within the Sepulveda Basin with respect to unhoused occupants and mitigating fire risk.
- B. Motion: Due to growing community concerns about the Oak Tree Inn transitional housing facility, the Encino Neighborhood Council opposes it unless the "<u>Community Conditions and Requirements</u>" proposed by the Encino Property Owners Association are accepted by Hope The Mission and Village Family Services, and they enter into a privately enforceable agreement.
- C. Motion: ENC Public Safety Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting <u>CF 25-0748</u>. This is a motion for the City to draft a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to seek records that provide transparency into federal immigration enforcement activity within the City as of January 1, 2025.

16. New Business

A. Motion: Discussion and possible action on whether the Encino Neighborhood Council would like to partner with Council District 4 on an upcoming "Know Your Rights" training, presented in collaboration with Public Counsel and the Reseda Neighborhood Council. The training, which will address the recent ICE raids impacting communities in the Valley—including a recent raid at the Auto Spa at White Oak and Ventura—will be held via Zoom on July 31st at 6:00 p.m. If approved, the Encino Neighborhood Council's logo would be included on promotional materials for the event.

16. Adjournment

The Encino Neighborhood Council (ENC), is a Certified Neighborhood Council of the City of Los Angeles which ADVISES

The ENC is made up of volunteers who are ELECTED by the community who live, work or otherwise are involved in the community of ENCINO. The ENC also makes appropriations of City Funds for Community Projects and needs as requested and approved by various committees and the general board.

Public comment on agenda items is limited to 1 minutes per speaker per item, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board or Committee.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

(C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.

(D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or

other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

(E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public

comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph

(D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

(ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
