  - A. **Motion to reschedule November 26 and December 24 Board meetings:** The regularly scheduled November ENC Board meeting is the day before Thanksgiving, and the December Board meeting is the day before Christmas.
    - Motion: Encino Neighborhood Council will cancel regular November & December meetings and instead schedule one meeting on Wednesday December 3, 2025. (Exec passed 5-0)

Atwater example mission statement "To organize and execute special events. Works with communication and outreach committee to ensure the maximum participation by AVNC Stakeholders."
  - C. Motion to affirm Greater Toluca Lake NC Declaration of Commitment to
    Representative Government: The Encino Neighborhood Council joins the Greater Toluca
    Lake Neighborhood Council by affirming their "Declaration of Commitment to
    Representative Government" dated June 17th, 2025, and support its principles of
    Neighborhood Council rights to communicate and advocate to any level of government on
    behalf of their stakeholders. (Exec passed 5-0)
  - D. <u>CPC-2023-3134-DB-SPP-HCA</u> **EPOA** appeal of **16610** Ventura Blvd: A 5 story 45 units mixed use project. An appeal has been filed by the Encino Property Owner's Association on the approval of this project with the Los Angeles Planning and Land Use Committee. Concerns about parking access to the residences via the alley south of Ventura Blvd is a concern.

**MOTION**: The ENC PLU Committee recommends the ENC Board support the appeal filed by EPOA to revoke the permit for this development. (PLU passed 6-0)

E. <u>CF 25-0642</u> - Seeks citywide elimination of off-street parking requirements for new development and changes of use.

**MOTION**: The ENC PLU Committee recommends the ENC Board vote to object to CF 25-0642 and write a CIS in objection to the motion. (PLU passed 6-0)

#### SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

- (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.
- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph
- (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to

allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
