SECTION II - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

Channelization of the LA River has polluted and destroyed much of our local riparian habitats in the last century. With collective education and stewardship, we can restore the River to a vibrant, functioning ecosystem that supports biodiversity and climate resilience. Friends of the LA River will host our 35th Annual Great LA River CleanUp this October, mobilizing ~1,000 volunteers to remove ~25,000 pounds of trash and debris from the LA River and tributaries. About 300 volunteers will clean a section in the Sepulveda Basin. Later in the fiscal year, we will run our 3rd Annual Earth Day Habitat Restoration & Celebration at the Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve, engaging ~500 volunteers in hands-on restoration, nature walks, and river education activities. This request would partially fund equipment rental, permits, marketing and advertising, supplies, printing, staff travel, and snacks for both events. CleanUp and Earth Day will improve the LA River's and watershed's health and enhance the surrounding communities' collective wellbeing and capacity for river stewardship.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

Since 1989, our annual Great LA River CleanUp has engaged tens of thousands of volunteers to remove upwards of 1.6 million pounds of trash and debris from the LA River, protecting our local waterways, beaches, and the Pacific Ocean. This grant will partially fund this year's Great LA River CleanUp, benefiting the public by improving the environmental health of the LA River and creating an opportunity for volunteers to meaningfully connect with urban nature. Removing trash and debris will enhance the river's quality, restore natural riparian habitat, and create a safer and more enjoyable space for recreation. Further, this grant will help restore ~0.5 acres of native habitat in the Sepulveda Basin. Both initiatives foster community involvement, raising awareness about environmental issues and promoting active river stewardship among hundreds of community members. By engaging diverse communities in a collective effort to steward the river, these annual events support public health, environmental education, and community cohesion, contributing to a healthier, dynamic, and verdant LA River ecosystem.



This supersedes our letter dated July 11, 1994.


