A. CalTrans Presentation - Amestoy Pedestrian Bridge Renovation and Louise Avenue overpass. Caltrans Public Information Representative Colleen Park, Project Manager and Design team will attend and provide a presentation on the proposed renovation project for the Amestoy Pedestrian Bridge. MAP LINK

Some information/bullets Discussion of CalTrans current community survey..information provided by Caltrans: on the project:

- Update Letter From Caltrans: <u>Update Letter</u>
- As a Department that serves the people of this district and the state of California, one of our goals is to develop an integrated transportation system that provides reliable and accessible mobility for all travelers. Since their construction in 1958, the Amestoy Avenue and Louise Avenue bridges have not been updated. This project was initiated after inspections found that the bridge railings for both structures need to be updated to meet current standards, as well as needing improvements to curb ramps to meet accessibility standards. The project has a webpage with current information: tinyurl.com/amestovovercrossing
- The City of Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) has expressed official support in favor of maintaining the pedestrian crossing at Amestoy Avenue. LADOT's Transportation Planning & Policy division conducted a connectivity analysis to measure the impacts of removing the pedestrian bridge, and found its removal would greatly impact connectivity to hundreds of jobs for thousands of Encino residents, as well as impacting access to one school.

#### **LADOT Report on Amestoy Pedestrian Bridge**

- Caltrans will keep the community informed as we evaluate this project addressing pedestrian connectivity across U.S. 101 in Encino, which is programmed for work in **2028**. It is currently in the Environmental Phase (Phase 0) which can take a year or more, and involves public input, as well as studies, documents, and processes required by state and federal law.

We do not want the community to feel limited in the time they have to give comments. There will be ample time and opportunities to give feedback.
- There will be environmental scoping meeting/s this fall, likely both an in-person event and virtual. We will do outreach for a month in advance to raise awareness and give the entire community enough notice to attend.

The ENC is made up of volunteers who are ELECTED by the community who live, work or otherwise are involved in the community of ENCINO. The ENC also makes appropriations of City Funds for Community Projects and needs as requested and approved by various committees and the general board.

#### SB 411 Undates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

(C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative

body and offer comments in real time.

- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
  - (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
  - (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

PUBLIC INPUT AT NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETINGS – Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to one (1) minute per speaker per item, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board or Committee. Consent items which have been unanimously approved by a public committee meeting are exempted unless pulled from the consent section by a Board member.
