Event Overview

Friends of the LA River invites you to join us for our **35th annual Great LA River CleanUp** this October, the largest urban River CleanUp in the country.

This year, thousands of Angelenos will gather at four sites: Willow Street

Bridge and Bond Park on **October 11**; Sepulveda Basin Sports Complex and

Compton Creek on **October 18** to remove trash, restore habitat, and reconnect with the River.

This year's CleanUp is a chance to roll up your sleeves, meet neighbors, and take direct action for a healthier, more resilient Los Angeles.

What to Expect

- Two volunteer shifts each day: **8:00 AM** and **10:30 AM**, each lasting about two hours
- Gloves, bags, and supplies provided on-site
- Opportunities to learn about local ecology and see the impact of your work
- Family-friendly and group-friendly volunteer sites across the upper, middle and lower sections of the River.

Why Do We Do This?



The LA River carries the story of our city. Every piece of trash removed keeps it from flowing into the ocean, protects wildlife, and helps restore habitat. But the CleanUp is also about people. By coming together in action, we remind ourselves that the River belongs to all of us, and that we have the power to shape a healthier future for Los Angeles.

Everyone! Longtime River advocates, first-time visitors, schools, corporate groups, families, and friends are welcome at any of our sites. The CleanUp is for anyone ready to spend a morning outdoors making a tangible difference.
