Earlier this month City Council adopted legislation to reform 911 emergency response system to address call wait times by hiring Police Service representatives to solely handle non-emergency calls and also exploring the creation of a separate armed crisis response dispatch. Trees were trimmed on median at Louise and Ventura.

D. Council File 25-0331 - MOTION: ENC will submit a CIS supporting CF 25-0331. This requests

a report to assess consolidating the Crisis and Incident Response through Community-Led Engagement (CIRCLE) program and the Unarmed Model of Crisis Response (UMCR) into one program in hopes of reducing operational costs and providing more uniform service throughout the city. (Public Safety passed 4-0)

- E. <u>Council File 25-0969</u> ENC Public Safety Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 25-0969 which seeks to withdraw the maximum legally allowable funding from LAHSA and instead contracts with Department of Homeless Services and Housing which is the new County department of homelessness. (Public Safety passed 4-0)
- F. Council File 25-0002-S77 ENC Public Safety Committee recommends submitting a CIS supporting CF 25-0002-S77 which is a City Council resolution supporting Senate Bill 682 (Allen). SB 682 regulates PFAS in consumer products under the Safer Consumer Products Program, advancing statewide efforts to protect environmental and human health. (Public Safety passed 4-0)
- G. Council File 20-0263-S3 ENC Executive Committee recommends submitting a CIS opposing CF 20-0263-S3. This is a request for the city to authorize a total of \$5,904,000 to pay an outside law firm. The law firm will appeal a judgement which implements oversight on the City's compliance with its commitments to create nearly homeless shelter and housing. The City Attorney wants to avoid oversight of homeless services.

- B. **Motion to revise ENC budget:** The Encino Neighborhood Council authorizes the reallocation of rollover funds totaling \$9,746.76 from the previous fiscal year. These funds shall be incorporated into the 2025–2026 Budget as listed below, resulting in a revised total budget of \$34,746.76 (Finance passed 5-0)
 - **General Office Expense**: Increased from \$100 to **\$1,146.76** (+\$1,046.76)
 - Meeting Costs Refreshments: Increased from \$500 to \$1,000 (+\$500)
 - Outreach Events / Promotions: Increased from \$8,500 to \$12,700 (+\$4,200)

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

- (C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.
- (D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.
- (E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph
- (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.
- (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.
- (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
