A dramatic rescue of an injured pelican took place at the end of October. The bird had been spotted in the Wildlife Reserve entangled in discarded fishing line and a plastic bottle. The Specialized Mobile Animal Rescue Team was able to capture the bird and transport it to the International Bird Rescue in San Pedro. "Firebird" is being treated for leg and wing wounds from the fishing line.

Sepulveda Basin Commemorative Grove
