5. Signal timing Northbound Hayvenhurst Ave @ Ventura Blvd.

MOTION: The ENC supports adding additional seconds to the Northbound Hayvenhurst Ave traffic light. Many cycles are three seconds which is not adequate for the volume of cars entering and exiting Gelson's market and the bank/medical building on Ventura Blvd. This is also a heavy pedestrian zone

6. The Resurfacing of Hayvenhurst Ave Under the 101:

The resurfacing below the 101 freeway there is already in the works and is a separate project from the project on Burbank. The issue we are having and why it has taken so long is because Cal trans will not approve of any nightly ramp closures there. We need the ramps closed off in order to do this at night (due to highly traveled route). BSS has been submitting new route plans to Cal trans and they still have not approved it.

7. Green Arrows Requests for White Oak @ Burbank Blvd. by a Stakeholder.

The north/south traffic signal light at White Oak and Burbank does not have left-turn green arrows. This is bizarre to me as the the east/west signal does. With the freeway and Trader Joe's right there you can imagine the congestion and frustration. How do we go about adding this feature? It would be great if it was also a Smart Light. So many of the signals in Los Angeles are not smart, which contributes to accidents since drivers constantly have to turn left on right light. (Alyssa Boyle)
