Lauren Haverlock



In order to vote in the 2021 Neighborhood Council Election, you will need to request a ballot. The ballot request period closes on April 27th. In addition to submitting the ballot request form, you will also need to submit proof of residency. This is to ensure you receive the correct ballot. Usually a copy of your driver's license or a copy of a utility bill will suffice.

Ballots can be completed online or you can mail the ballot to the City.

Both the online ballot request portal and form can be accessed from our website: www.encinonc.org.

Once you receive & complete your ballot you can mail it back to the City or drop it off at our drop box location.

If you mail your ballot to the City, please make sure it's postmarked by May 4th.

If you prefer to drop off your ballot at our drop box, it's located at Encino Park, the same one used for the National Election. The drop box will be open on April 30th at 8am and close on May 4th at 8pm. Encino Park is located at 16953 Ventura Blvd.







3. You'll be directed to the vote by mail page, once there click on NC Candidate Filing Portal



4. If you do not have a voter account setup, you will need to create one before you can continue to create the voter application. Just follow the instructions.



5. Follow the instructions to complete and submit your application. Please note, you will need to submit documentation showing your residency, usually a driver's license is sufficient. Before submitting your request, please upload your documentation to avoid any lag in receiving your ballot.

2. If you clicked on download the application and mail it in, you'll be directed to our forms page. Once there click on the 2021 Vote By Mail Application.



3. The form will open and you will be able to fill it out and print it or download and print it.

4. Before mailing in your request for a ballot, you will also need to provide documentation showing residency or that you work in Encino. For residency a driver's license usually suffices. If you work in Eninco, you will need to provide documentation that you work in Encino.
