

To whom it may concern,

Over the last few years, Mulholland has increasingly turned to diversity, equity, and inclusion by designing and implementing school policies to resolve inequities. Teachers, for example, order more classroom books with stories that better reflect students' racial diversity. In addition, the district mandates anti-bias training to prevent stereotyping that can threaten student progress, such as setting lower expectations for students of color. On the micro level, these changes open educators' eyes to just how inequitable schools can be and bring into focus how to start resolving inequities and making Mulholland Middle School more diverse, equitable, inclusive, and more effective through a school garden project.

Our garden education team observed various special education classroom teachers. It worked closely with teachers to provide guidance and best practices to include all students in a garden-based learning project. We will search online to gather inclusion strategies and adaptive gardening practices that best apply to garden-based learning. Finally, we will share with other garden educators, as well as general and special education teachers' information regarding growing various fruits and vegetables, the importance of gardening as a lifelong hobby, and the development of student self-reliance.

One key to the success of Mulholland's School Garden Project is developing community buy-in. The collaborative community partnership strengthens an ongoing reciprocal relationship that fosters safe and inclusive spaces. As a result, continuous assessment of program impact can be accessible and community-centered. Mulholland will complete the garden project by June 2023.
